- (4) To orient the students towards the requirements of society through NSS and in collaboration with NGOs.

PART – A

Plan of Action : 2010-11

As part of a drive towards enhancing the quality of education, the College took series of measures both for the students and teaching fraternity. While doing so, the recommendations of the Peer Team of the Re-Accreditation were given top priority.

(1) To encourage the teachers to attend various workshops / seminars and conferences.

- As a result of this, some 12 teachers attended the conferences and updated their knowledge.

(2) The teachers were also encouraged to read their papers in these conferences.

- As a response to this, some 07 teachers made their paper presentations in various conferences.

(3) More and more teachers were encouraged to undertake Major and Minor Research Project in their respective discipline.

- It is a matter of great pleasure for us that so far **5** teachers completed their Minor Research Projects.
- One of the teachers of the College Dr. B. T. Ambhore is currently working on his Major Research Project.
- Besides them, some **13** other teachers have been given approval for carrying out Minor Research Projects by UGC.

(4) To open consultancies in their field of expertise.

- It is a matter of satisfaction that an humble attempt is made in this direction.

(5) To submit the proposals of Career Oriented Courses.

- The College submitted the proposal of 10 Career Oriented Courses and the Coordinator attended the Interface Meeting in the UGC Office, New Delhi.

(6) More and more teachers were encouraged to go in for registration of Ph.Ds.

- The College now boasts in having **23** teachers with Ph.D. as the highest degree and **01** teacher with M.Phil. as the highest degree.
- Out of the total staff of 32 teachers, the percentage of teachers with research degrees comes to 75%.

(7) The teachers were also encouraged to become Ph.D. Supervisors.

- At least **03** teachers of the College have been recognized as Ph.D. supervisors.

(8) The teachers were also encouraged / to contribute articles to newspaper and research journals.

(9) The College organized workshops and seminars.

(2) For the Students:

- The students are encouraged to join Career Oriented, Remedial Courses and the workshops the College organized for NET/SET students.
- The teaching staff of the College has offered cash incentives to the toppers in the University examinations. Some 30 cash prizes are offered every year to meritorious students.
- To arrange for the students various competitions like debates, symposia, singing competition, etc. to tap their latent talent.
- Many students of the College participated in cultural programmes and debate competition organized by the University and other fora.
- In the field of sports, the students have brought laurels to the College. (The details are given in the later portion of the report).
- Some of the departments of the College organized various study tours and excursions of the students.

- The College through the organs like NSS and NCC undertake various schemes benefiting the community and society at large. (The details are in the relevant portion of the report).
- Tree plantation was undertaken on a massive scale to beautify the College campus.
- The NSS wing of the College has been particularly very active in creating social awareness among the villages by holding camps there and impressing upon them the importance of water conservation.
- A 'bandhara' (a wall to arrest the flow of water) was also built through voluntary labour.

(3) Development of Infrastructure :

- The College decided to make residential arrangement particularly of the girl students.

The proposal therefore was sent to the UGC and was sanctioned for adding **two** more stories to accommodate 50 girl students to take the total accommodation to 120.

The facilities in the boys' Hostel were also upgraded to a great extent to make their stay comfortable.

- The construction of two more rooms was undertaken to take the tally of number of rooms to **24**.
- Separate P.G. departments for each P.G. course is one more feature of the College.
- The College proposed in the beginning of the session to have a Language Laboratory for the students.
- This was not only achieved but a complete digitization of the library was also successfully completed.
- Separate laboratories for the practical subjects like Home-Economics and Geography have already been in existence.
- Water coolers and water purifiers were also installed on the premises of the College.

- The students have been provided internet facility by linking it to Broadband.
- In spite of the fact that the College building is pre-independence one, renovation has been done from time to time to maintain its majesty.

(4) Other Activities :

- To encourage the non-teaching staff of the College to undertake training in Computer courses and efficiency enhancing training.
- To celebrate various birth anniversaries of the proud sons of India like Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh, Mahatma Fule, Savitribai Phule, Mahatma Gandhi, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar, Rajmata Jijau and Swami Vivekanand.
- To upgrade the website of the College.

PART – B

(1) Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution :

The goals and objectives aiming for excellence in academic field and honing the skills of different constituent factors at stake have been amply fulfilled and reflected in the various activities of the college throughout the year and increase the number of courses imparting training to the students, more active participation in extension activities (NSS & NCC), wider variety of community services, all these contributed towards moulding skills and personalities of the students.

(2) New Academic Programmes initiated :

The College started **2** Career Oriented Courses in recent past. The College has also submitted the proposal of starting **10** courses in Banking and Insurance, Web Designing, Office Automation, B.P.O., E-Commerce, Certificate in French, Social Auditing, GIS and Remote Sensing, Tours and Travel Management. Subject to the approval of UGC, the College is willing to start the programmes.

The College has undertaken Remedial Coaching Classes particularly for the students lagging behind the studies.

(3) Innovations in curricular design and transaction :

(a) The College takes pride in the fact that one of our faculty members Dr. B. T. Gawande is the Dean of Commerce faculty in our parent university i.e. Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati

Another faculty member Prof. Prakash Tayade is the Chairman of Board of Studies in the same university. They are, therefore, actively involved in curricular designing and syllabus restructuring.

At least three other staff members Prof. Avinash Deshmukh, Dr. Varsha Chikhale and Dr. Ramesh Kale are the members of the Boards of Studies in R.T.M. Nagpur and S.G.B. Amravati University.

(24) Computerisation of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates:

The College has already developed its website www.shivajicollege.org Office Computerisation has already been completed. Issuance of certificates is done with the computers. The data of admissions of students, the fees paid by them and their progress in Test examinations is stored in the computers. The annual examination, however, is conducted by the University and therefore, the mark lists of the students' annual examination are prepared by the university which are subsequently distributed to the students through the College Office.

(25) Increase in Infrastructural facilities:

The College is situated on its own land of more than six acres. It has an independent building for the College Office and Chamber of the Principal.

The College has two separate laboratories for Home-Economics and Geography.

In a sprawling building of the College, there are in all 22 rooms besides the Girls' Common Room and Staff Room.

Each P.G. department has been given the separate wing and Mass Communication department has developed a studio.

The capacity of the Girls' hostel is to be doubled in the next academic session with the sanction of additional grant of Rs.39.00 Lakh. It will greatly increase the residential facility of the girls coming from the different talukas of the district.

(28) Financial Aid to Students:

The College offers to its students all the scholarships by the Government of Maharashtra as Open Merit Scholarship, High School Teachers' Ward Scholarship, Govt. of India Scholarship, Freedom Fighter Scholarship, Economically Backward Classes Concession, etc. Besides this, the College also offers its own scholarship of Rs.250/- per month / year.

The teaching staff of the College encourages the students of the College to excel in University examination by offering them cash incentive. Some 25 teachers of the College have contributed so far to this venture of giving cash incentives to the university toppers.

(32) Performance in Sports Activities:

The College Girls' badminton team emerged winner in the Inter-collegiate tournament 9th time in a row which is a record in itself.

The College takes pride in the fact that at least its 11 students represented S.G.B. Amravati University in the Inter University tournament at All India Level. The sports swimming, Ball badminton, Kabaddi, Gymnastics, Baseball, Handball and Softball.

At least **twenty three** students of the College represented the State of Maharashtra in All India Level Tournament again in different sports like Ball Badminton, Softball, Sepak Takara, Power Lifting, Dodge-ball and Handball.

(38) Healthy Practices of the Institution:

(a) Inauguration of Literary & Study Associations of the Students:

In order to give a platform to the students, the Association of students are formed every year and the opportunity is given to the students not only to listen to the

learned lectures of the experts in their respective field and also to express their own thoughts on these occasions.

Other programmes like Wild Life Photo Exhibition, environmental protection are also held throughout the year.

(b) Observance of Birth Anniversaries of the founders of the Society:

Every year, the birth anniversaries of our founder president Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh, Mahatma Gandhi, Shashtriji, Shivjayanti, Youth Day to mark Swami Vivekananda's birthday, Teachers' Day are observed to inculcate on the minds of the students the moral values preached by them.

(c) Disciplinary matters and Uniform and Identity Cards:

The use of the mobile is strictly prohibited on the College campus. The students are given the dress code and keeping the identity card with them is mandatory.

A strict discipline is maintained in the college campus by the Principal and other staff members.

An extremely attractive prospectus is published every year which gives complete idea to the students about the college and its activities, teaching staff and fees, scholarships, cash prizes and the photographs of those who have brought laurel to the students are also published.

11) To upgrade the facilities offered in the College.

12) To make special efforts through Remedial Courses to bring on par with the other students, the students from economically and socially backward classes.
